Walkability

Trips are rated by their "walkability," meaning how active a trip is, in order to judge your ability to keep up with the group. A sneaker appears in the trip description.

- Indicates very easy, with little incline
- Indicates moderate, ability to walk at a moderate pace
- Landicates slightly strenuous, ability to walk quickly for up to 30 minutes
- Indicates strenuous activity, ability to move quickly over uneven terrain for longer periods of time

- All motor coach trips include bus driver's tips, guide tips and snacks

SECURE Act 2.0 What you need to know

Beginning in January 2023, the SECURE Act 2.0 is now law. The law builds on earlier legislation and adds several changes surrounding retirement savings and planning. The bill has a little something for everyone, whether you're nearing/in retirement, or in earlier accumulation years. Not all changes go into effect in 2023, but many of these updates are positive for retirement savers. Here is a summary of some of the major updates.

RMD CHANGES

Starting in 2023, the age at which owners of retirement accounts must start taking required minimum distributions (RMDs) will increase from 72 to 73. So, individuals will now have an additional year to delay taking a mandatory withdrawal from their pre-tax retirement accounts. Further, the penalty for failing to take an RMD will decrease to 25% of the RMD amount not taken. This is down from the previous 50%. It's also possible to get that penalty down to 10%. Additionally, Roth accounts in employer retirement plans will be exempt from the RMD requirements starting in 2024.

MATCHING FOR ROTH ACCOUNTS

Beginning in 2023, employers can provide employees the option of receiving matching contributions to Roth accounts. Previously, matching in employer-sponsored plans were made only on a pre-tax basis. Contributions to a Roth retirement plan are made after-tax, which allow for earnings to grow tax-free. Note that the employer Roth contribution will be seen as taxable to the employee in the year received.

529 COLLEGE SAVINGS PLANS

After 15 years, 529 college savings plan assets can be rolled over to a Roth IRA for the beneficiary. This is subject to annual Roth contribution limits and a lifetime limit of \$35,000. The amount rolled over goes towards the annual Roth IRA contribution limit. This can potentially relieve the concern that some parents or grandparents have about children not using 529 funds and gives an additional attractive avenue to use excess funds for the child's benefit.

DO NOT:


- Call the phone number provided

IF YOU DID ONE OF THE ABOVE ITEMS:


- Disconnect your computer or device from the internet




